While at MSU, Medin switched majors to Construction Management, and really enjoyed learning from professor, Dr. Scott Fee who taught a scheduling class. Outside of the classroom, he volunteered his time as a CMSA committee member and interned at Braun Intertec Corporation. "What I really like about our CM program is that they really improved my interpersonal skills and made me think about the small things that add up in the end." he said.

After college, Medin received offers from both Mortenson Company and PCL Construction doing either wind farms or buildings. He thought he would enjoy constructing buildings more and so he joined PCL Construction as a Field Engineer out of Minneapolis.
